At Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP), we do more than make a difference in the lives of children — we also offer residents unmatched opportunities to train to be the pediatric healthcare leaders of tomorrow.

Options and Excellence

CHOP offers four residency training options, all of which are accredited by the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education. In any given year, we have approximately 150 residents.

- General Pediatrics (three years)
- General Pediatrics and Child Neurology (five years)
- General Pediatrics and Genetics (four years)
- Internal Medicine-General Pediatrics (four years)

While the goal of our program is to provide excellent training in General Pediatrics, we have developed training paths in acute care, medical subspecialty care, primary care and hospital medicine that let residents focus on their interests and career goals. Residents select a path over the course of the first year, and in years two and three, complete six Individual Educational Units (IEUs) that fit that path.

We are also proud of the training our residents gain in child advocacy, quality improvement, patient safety, health equity and clinical informatics — skills that are critical to 21st century healthcare.

What Makes CHOP Special

With nearly 30,000 inpatient stays and more than 1.3 million outpatient visits a year, CHOP offers trainees the opportunity to see the full spectrum of illness, injury and disease. Our patients come from all over the region — and the world, with 114 different countries represented. Few other programs offer this level of diversity.

Our residents consistently report that they feel supported by peers, department chairs and chief administrators. We listen to and appreciate the roles of house staff, and make certain that residents' voices are heard through mentoring systems, annual retreats, regular house staff meetings, resident representation on committees and more.
