Infectious Disease Program



The goal of our three-year Fellowship program is to train infectious disease specialists through a broad-based experience in research, teaching and clinical experiences. Our southern California location provides exposure to a variety of immigrant and through-traveler populations enabling diverse clinical and research opportunities. We try hard to accommodate our curriculum to each individual Fellow's needs. In addition to exposure to our Faculty at Harbor we have other pediatric ID specialists integrated into our teaching program including those from Kaiser Permanente, and Long Beach Miller Children's Hospital. Further, we send Fellows to other academic/university-based hospitals and the LA County Department of Public Health for increased exposure to other more focused areas of infectious disease.

Our research strengths include disease epidemiology, outcomes research, vaccine implementation, infection control and prevention, cost-burden/effectiveness studies, and HIV clinical trials. Our work has/is funded by AHRQ, NIH, CDC, PCORI, industry, and foundations. Other research opportunities are available in collaboration locally with the Division of Adult Infectious Diseases at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center (which includes national experts in several areas) and elsewhere throughout the region.
