

An update to GPEDS!

The Global Pediatric Education Series (GPEDS) has undergone a substantial update. This program, originally launched in 2011, is an online curriculum developed to provide foundational knowledge preparation for pediatric providers interested in working in an under-resourced setting. The program is currently utilized by a number of pediatric residency training programs around the country as the primary Global Health curriculum for their trainees.

We launched GPEDS 2.0 in November of 2019 as a full update to the course, ensuring that the content is current and in line with current global health goals. We worked hard to revise the course materials, update all of the lectures, and give the course a new coat of paint. This mountainous effort could not have been completed without the help of numerous faculty from the University of Minnesota, and our partner institutions abroad. Course content includes 4 topic-based modules comprised of 29 lectures. Modules include: Fundamentals of Global Child Health, Disease Identification and Management, Clinical Pearls and Preparation for Work Abroad, and Global Health at Home.

This course is available for institutional subscription, allowing access for unlimited trainees, or to individual subscribers interested in taking the course for 24 hours of CME credit. In the wake of COVID-19, we have successfully adapted this curriculum to be a virtual clerkship for medical students as well. The nature of the course material allows facilitators to be flexible in when and to how many students the program is offered. Proceeds generated by the sale of this course are used to subsidize costs involved in bringing our international partners to the University of Minnesota; we feel strongly that bidirectionality is important for these partnerships.
